- **3. IMPERATRICE LOVE -** Unplaced on lone appearance here but came an encouraging 3rd of 10, on first start back, in a 2400m Amiens Class F on 19 April. Mathieu Mottier reining this time and will be expected to finish in the mix
- **4. IL MAGNIFICO** Useful type making first appearance since finishing 10th of 13 in a 2750m Cabourg Class E late-October. Is shod to preference and can set the cat among the pigeons if Dominik Locqueneux keeps him trotting

Summary: A useful trotter in both disciplines, INTELLO D'ERABLE (5) has one race in him since the winter break, is barefoot for his return to harness competition and can have his day in the sun. François Lagadeuc will be justifiably wary of IDEAL DU GOULOT (10) who returns barefoot to Caen on a right-handed hat-trick, and IDEO JOSSELYN (8) who is herself bidding for a Caen 3-timer. - **3. KOCAINE BOND -** Made no bones about securing a 2400m Amiens Class F on 19 April. Steps up in category though and may find this a stiff test
- **4. KASSIOPEE WIND -** Promising sort but makes her first appearance since coming 4th of 10 in a 2700m Vincennes Class D last September. Shoes on and will be race-rusty
- **5. KALEA DREAM -** In 3 starts, has never shown any liking for Caen, most recently sanctioned in a 2450m Class E here 2 weeks ago. Disregard
- **6. KATANA -** Unexceptional 8th to KAMA D'EM (2) in a Class E over course and distance on 22 April and can expect to have few takers
- **7. KELISSA D'AVE -** Runner-up to the unassailable KAI LA SHA (16) in a 2750m Class E at La Capelle on 7 April. Entrusted to Yoann Lebourgeois this time and will be afforded every chance
- **8. KLASSIKA DIDALO -** Has turned a corner lately, coming 2nd to KAMA D'EM (2) over track and trip 2 weeks ago. Is a progressive filly and one to keep an eye on
- **9. KINDIA DU CHENE -** Good, consistent type that came a good 2nd of 15 on re-entry in a 2350m Angers Class E on 11 April. Will have progressed and can get straight down to business. Claim

- 3. KNOCK OUT MAKER Remarkable early last season but has not raced since faulting in a 2100m Vincennes Class D mid-January. Here for reasons of conditioning and can be passed over
- **4. KINGMAN DELO -** Mixes the good with the less good but came a decent 3rd of 10 finishers in a Class E over 2200m here 8 days ago, and returns with morale intact and a realistic chance

- **4. JASMIN DHELPA -** 5th of 9 finishers in a 2650m Bordeaux Class E last Monday. Has never managed to finish a race when barefoot and cannot be considered a contender
- **5. JEUNE AMI -** Clearly back at the top of his game since the spell, most recently 4th behind JASMIN PHIL (15) in a 2875m Enghien Class D a fortnight back. Théo Duvaldestin reining this time and will not be far from the action
- **6. JUVAMINE RENARDIER -** Sprang a 75/1 surprise when 3rd, a place behind JAFAR DE FAEL (3), in a Class E over course and distance late last month, but a repeat seems improbable

- **3. LUGANO -** Sanctioned in both starts to date, most recently a 2625m Cherbourg Class F last weekend. Yoann Lebourgeois reining this time which may be just the ticket to his redemption
- **4. LETS GO UP -** Faulted early, on comeback, in a Class E over course and distance 8 days ago and can be ruled out
- **5. LOUSTIC DELAURIERE -** Unremarkable colt that was sanctioned in a 2900m Challans Class F on Monday and can expect to remain friendless in the markets
