- **1. JAG HAUFOR -** 9th of 14, on re-entry, in a 2850m Laval Class E a week ago. Seldom disappoints here but is still in conditioning mode and can be ruled out
- **2. JUAN CARLOS GIFONT -** Pleasant 5th of 9, on comeback, in a 2600m Saint-Galmier Class D a month ago. Not the sharpest horse here though and others preferred
- **3. JUEN EMONDEVILLE -** 2nd of 14 in a 2850m Class D here 3.5 weeks ago. Has turned a corner lately, has yet to disappoint for Benjamin Rochard and, sporting a fresh configuration, must not be underestimated
- **4. JACKPOT JOMUNA -** Won 3 of last 4, most recently a 2800m Strasbourg Class E 3 weeks ago. Unshod-all-4 this time but may just be biting off more than he can chew
- **5. JERZINO VICI -** Ran 6th over shorter here before an unthreatening 7th of 10 in a 2875m Argentan Class A on 3 November and, even though reconfigured, is unlikely to shake things up
- **6. JOVIAL HAUFOR -** Last but one when prepping for this in a 2825m Chartres Class E 11 days ago. Appreciates Vincennes and looks to have a realistic chance of finishing close
- **7. JOHORE -** Unraced since winning a 2175m Class E here on 13 September. Has yet to deliver over 2700m here but, with form maintained, can play a prominent role
- **8. JAGUAR DJOB -** Was being conditioned when 10th of 15 in 20 October race of reference. Has previously imposed over track and trip when barefoot and cannot be discounted
- 9. JOPLIN DES CROUAS Sanctioned in last 3, latterly a 2900m Challans Class D a month ago. Has no particular liking for Vincennes and can be passed over
- **10. JE T'AIME** Returns to racing barefoot after finishing 6th of 12 in a 2825m Chartres Class E on 4 November. Has previously delivered here when barefoot but not an obvious choice this time
- **11. JIPET DE CREPIN -** Was preparing for this when 7th of 13 in a 2950m Saint-Malo harness Class F a fortnight ago. Won over course and distance last time in this configuration and can repeat

JIPET DE CREPIN (11) thrives under these conditions, will be fit by now and, shod to preference, with Eric Raffin in the bike, can make a big splash. JOHORE (7) has been afforded ample time to recuperate after winning over shorter here and, barefoot for the occasion, is unlikely to disappoint. JOVIAL HAUFOR (6) faces his first objective of the winter and, although arguably better over shorter, still merits respect.

- 2. KEYBOARD Reliability not his strong suit, latterly failing to confirm Caen effort when 11th of 15, behind KNOK (1), in a 2700m Class C here late last month. Deserves the benefit of the doubt however and should not be overlooked
- **3. KRONO DU TRIO -** Surprising 3rd of 6 finishers in a 2450m Caen Class C on 20 October. Competitively-shod this time, will have come on for the run, and looks the pick of the field

- **14. LAVANDE DE ROCHE -** Drops in category after running 5th of 10 in a 2100m Class B here on 11 October. Sports 4 pads this time, with Eric Raffin in the wagon, but a minor place chance at best
- **15. LA VIVA DE LOU -** Won a Class D over course and distance on re-entry on 24 October. Has had time to come on, enjoys a fine entry here, and will be competitive for the win

Summary: Winner of 2 from 3 since returning to competition, LOUANGE CASTELETS (7) takes to the main track for the first time but still looks the one to beat. Yoann Lebourgeois will still be keeping a keen eye on the progressive LADY DADA (9) who sports 4 pads for the first time, and late-September course-and-distance winner, LA VIVA DE LOU (15). Winner late last month on her first start with Mathieu Mottier, LILY DE L'AUNAY (13) is unlikely to repeat but can still challenge for a place in the frame.

- **1. LEADER DES BAULTS -** Sanctioned on monté debut 10 days ago in a 2700m Class E here, and in this company has no possible chance
- **2. LOVE DE BEAULIEU -** Sanctioned in last 2, most recently a 2700m Class E here 10 days ago, and will not be influencing the result
- **3. LOOK D'AVRIL -** 6th of 9 in a 2800m Vire harness Class E on 27 October and switches code for first time with modest ambition
- **4. LYNX DU LUPIN -** Takes a notable step up in category after finishing 4th of 13 in a 2625m Cherbourg Class F a fortnight ago, but is unlikely to spring any surprises
- **5. LOVE ME DO MESLOIS -** Made up for Caen sanction when runner-up to LOCKDOWN (6) in a 2000m Class E at La Capelle 9 days ago. Races with front pads for first time and, with application, will not be going home empty-handed
- **6. LOCKDOWN -** Got off the mark at La Capelle before faulting in a 2725m Pornichet Class D a fortnight ago. Just hind pads fitted this time, with Victor Saussaye in the irons, and must not be underestimated
- **7. LITTLEBOY DE PLANY -** Well-beaten 2nd to LATINO BEJI (15) in a 2750m Cabourg Class E late-October. Sanctioned more often than not but, on good behaviour, could eke out some prizemoney
- **8. LIPTON DU NOYER -** Out of the picture in last 2, latterly 10th of 13 in a 2150m Enghien harness Class D on 19 October, and makes his monté debut with little to contribute
- **9. LOOKING D'AURCY -** Left a good impression despite being sanctioned in a harness Class F over course and distance early this month. Makes monté bow with a leading jockey on board and can get straight down to business
- **10. LE BEST MADRIK -** Debuted nicely under the saddle at Enghien before coming 4th of 8 finishers in a 2725m Pornichet Class D 2 weeks ago. Guillaume Martin gets the nod here and has every chance of making first 5
- **11. LANDEVY -** Last of 11 in a 2050m Cabourg harness Class D a month ago. Races shod for monté debut and others easier to back
- **12. LEADER DES RIOULTS -** Sanctioned when preparing for this in a 2850m Hyeres harness Class D earlier in the month. Has displayed decent consistency under the saddle and can play a dominant role
- **13. LOULOU DE L'AUNAY -** Makes first public monté appearance after coming 3rd behind LANDEVY (11) in a 2725m Cabourg harness Class E early-October. Comes here fresh, with Mathieu Mottier in the saddle, and can get a look-in
- **14. LEON DE LA COURBE -** Respectable over the main track before being sanctioned in a 2850m Laval harness Class B 2 weeks ago. Has shown little liking for these conditions and can be passed over
- **15. LATINO BEJI** Has taken well to new vocation, latterly unopposed winner of a 2750m Cabourg Class E late-October and, if he takes to the new profile, can finish in the thick of things

16. LUKAS D'OLIVERIE - Unsure of stride when sanctioned in a 2875m Enghien Class D on 19 October. Can wrap this up though if Benjamin Rochard gets him off on the right foot

Summary: Arguably the most talented horse here, the wonderfully-entered LUKAS D'OLIVERIE (16) is not one for those with a heart condition but he can win this if he deigns to stay in stride. LOOKING D'AURCY (9) is not the most reliable either but has been entrusted to Alexandre Abrivard for his monté debut and can play a leading role if he takes to the new discipline. LATINO BEJI (15) opened his monté account 3 weeks ago and, even though unconfirmed racing left-handed, he is nevertheless very easy to like. Occasionally a handful, LEADER DES RIOULTS (12) will be ridden by Eric Raffin this time and does not make the long trip north for a simple place cheque.
