- **1. LIBERTINE DJOB -** Encouraged last time under the saddle before finishing last of 7 in a harness Class B prep under similar conditions late last month and, even with pads fitted for the first time, will have few friends
- **2. LOVELY KOOL -** Unexceptional filly that finished a place ahead of LIBERTINE DJOB (1) in a harness Class B over track and trip, and returns to the ridden code with limited aspirations
- **3. LALYLY BEY -** Sanctioned in a harness Class B over course and distance a fortnight back. Has shown promise in the monté code but not enough to be considered a priority
- **4. LIPANGA DE GUEZ -** Came in a good 4th of 7 finishers in a harness Class B over track and trip 2 weeks ago and makes her first appearance under the saddle with legitimate ambition
- **5. LA MOME -** Yet to show any aptitude for the discipline, most recently finishing a thrashed 7th of 8 behind LEXIE DE BANVILLE (9), and has no realistic chance

- **10. LET ME SHINE GIO -** Harness Gr.1 winner over the winter and most recently trotted 4th in Prix Ali Hawas. Will appreciate the shorter trip and racing with shoes may be key to her redemption. First-5 chance

Summary: LEXIE DE BANVILLE (9) has truly come into herself lately, beating most of these with ease in the Gr.2 Prix Ali Hawas 3 weeks ago and, if still on the boil, can pull off the hat-trick. Adrien Lamy will be more than aware of the presence of LITTLE ORELIE (8) who finished an eye-catching 2nd that day, and LYZIA DES AGETS (7) whose recent performance should not be over-analysed. Back in form under harness lately, LIPANGA DE GUEZ (4) debuts in the monté discipline with all the confidence of his astute trainer.

- 2. LORD DE BANVILLE Showed improvement when 3rd in a 2700m Class C earlier this month but, with shoes back on, will struggle to make his mark
- **3. LEADER DU CHATAULT** 3rd over 2100m here before authoritatively winning a 2600m Saint-Galmier Class D on 6 March. In better company this time but should nevertheless acquit himself honourably
- **4. LINDSTEDT -** Sanctioned in the Gr.3 Prix Penthesilea over 2700m here fortnight back. Previously ran 2nd to LIGHT MY FIRE (11) at Enghien and has a reasonable chance of making the first 5
- 5. LEADER DU POMMEAU Sanctioned in last 2, latterly a 2700m Class A here 2 months ago. Has ample talent and will have an important part to play if Eric Raffin keeps him trotting

Beautifully-bred and already a winner over course and distance, LE POETE BOURBON (7) will have his chances, as will LOBBING DE BLARY (6) who put in an eye-catching finish last time out.

- 2. LYNX ATOUT Lightly-raced colt that finished 4th behind LUTIN DES BORDES (5) in a Class C over track and trip. 4 pads fitted this time but others still preferred
- **3. LEANDRO DE MER -** Has potential but quickly sanctioned in a 2200m Class B here on 1 March and others easier to support
- **4. LUCKY CRISTAL** Well-beaten and flattering 4th to LUCKY SIBEY (12) in the race of reference and a repeat seems improbable
- **5. LUTIN DES BORDES -** Confirmed his monté promise when good 2nd of 5 finishers in a 2700m Class C here earlier this month. Will have progressed for the run and looks a player at this level

- **3. JARDIN D'ERABLE -** Imposed at Nancy late last month before trotting 3rd of 13 in a 2750m Class E at La Capelle last weekend. Steps up in category though and more a minor place prospect this time around
- **4. JAZZ -** 8th of 12 in a 2725m Lisieux Class E on 20 March and, barefoot or not, will struggle to make his presence felt
- 5. JOSVIL Sanctioned, when never dangerous, in a 2150m Enghien Class E on 26 March. Disregard

- 2. JUSTICIA SMART Tricky character that set the record straight with success in a 2650m Bordeaux Class D on 9 March. Has placed just once in last 11 starts here and can be passed over
- 3. JONQUILLE DE MEAT Sprang quite the surprise when comfortably winning a 2875m Enghien Class D on 19 March, her first start for 5 months and, with form maintained, could well pick up a minor place cheque
- **4. JOLIE POUPEE -** Unseen for almost 2 months since coming 5th of 10 in a Class C over course and distance. Has few references at this level and, although no slouch on a good day, is unlikely to shake things up
- **5. JAIN MAB -** Won a 2150m Enghien Class C mid-March. Pleased here more than once over the winter meeting but still no more than a minor place chance
- **6. JOLIE STAR -** Easy winner, when shod, of a 2850m Laval Class D 2 weeks ago. Goes barefoot this time and entrusted to a leading driver for the occasion, can bring home the bacon

JUST LOVE YOU (14) may not have been seen out since her excellent Critérium Continental performance but is barefoot for reentry and must not be underestimated. JAZZY PERRINE (15) is similarly returning from a break and, if fit, will be no easy touch.

- **3. KING GEORGES -** Progressive sort that was sanctioned on return to competition in a 2850m Class A here last weekend. Shoes on again and not a priority
- **4. KEROS DES BAUX -** Went off the boil last summer and sent for a break after coming 8th of 10 in a 2850m Mauquenchy Class A late-November. Barefoot for comeback, with Eric Raffin reining, but others still preferred

- GRINDELWALD Won 2 on the trot here before faulting in a 2925m Cagnes Class B a month ago. Has the inside line, boasts a fine turn of foot, and will be expected to redeem herself
- 2. HIDALGO DES NOES Disappointing on the whole this year, most recently coming last of 13 in a 2825m Class D at Le Croisé-Laroche on 9 March, and can expect to have few takers
- **3. GHALIE DU GOUTIER -** Tough mare that consistently gives what she can, latterly 5th of of 6 in a Class B under these conditions early last month. Is evidently better than that and, from the 3-spot, can go closer this time
- **4. EUREKA VRIE -** Challenging for a place when sanctioned in a 2900m Amiens Gr.3 on 6 March. Thrives over 2100m, form is not in doubt, and Eric Raffin will not be displeased by the draw
- **5. GIBUS -** Sanctioned, on first start back, in a 2875m Enghien monté Class C on 19 March. Will have benefitted from the run though and with Yoann Lebourgeois reining, can win this
- **6. FEE DE RANCHVAL -** Makes just 2nd start back after finishing a beaten 7th of 14 in a 2750m Eccomoy Class A on turf 12 days ago. Has done nothing of note here for some time and, even racing barefoot, can be ruled out
- 7. DORUCK Pleased at Cagnes before coming 10th of 14 in a 2625m Agen-Le Passage Class C last weekend and in this company will struggle to make his mark
- **8. ESTEBAN JIEL -** 9th of 18 in a 2200m Caen Class D mid-March. Is not to everyone's taste but has decent references under these conditions and will have his supporters
- **9. FANDANGO LA NUIT -** 12th of 16 when being conditioned, shod, in a 2625m Agen-Le Passage Class C 8 days ago. Is a tough nut to crack when barefoot and should not be far from the action
- **10. GOLD VOICE** Returns to the harness code after a disappointing 5th of 7 in a 2875m Enghien monté Class C. Starts on the back row but has solid course-and-distance credentials and her presence will not go unnoticed
- 11. DEGANAWIDAH Lacklustre last of 7 in a 2875m Enghien monté Class C, on re-entry, on 19 March and will have nothing to offer
- **12. HEADING REFERENCE -** Unraced since finishing last of 15 under similar conditions mid-December. Is barefoot for the occasion, has previously won over track and trip, and should generate some interest
- 13. GINKGO THELOIS Below-par when sanctioned in a Class C over course and distance a fortnight ago. Useful on a good day but, in present condition, will have little to offer
- 14. HURELLA Facile winner of a 2150m Enghien Class C mid-March. Shoes on though and will have other priorities
- **15. MUSETT AF DJUPMYRA -** Pleasantly surprise when 2nd, at 118/1, in a 2150m Mauquenchy Class D on 18 March. Poorly-drawn and a repeat is highly improbable
- **16. FELIX DU BOURG -** Honest trotter that finished 6th of 14 in a 2625m Agen-Le Passage Class C 8 days ago and despite a good entry, can be passed over

Summary: Although sanctioned under the saddle on his return from a brief spell, GIBUS (5) won twice here over the winter and, with front shoes off for his return to the harness code, can get straight down to business. EUREKA VRIE (4), on the other hand, requires no freshening up and will be dangerous if Eric Raffin keeps him trotting, which is similarly the case for GRINDELWALD (1) who trounced the boys on her last Vincennes start. Fourth in a Gr.3 over course and distance earlier in the year, GHALIE DU GOUTIER (3) is nicely-positioned in front and also looks to be in with a decent shout.
